


Professional Development: The Agenda for Recognition of Individual Career Achievement

IOM seeks to promote and support the adoption of Obsolescence Management best practice and actively promotes the professional development of practitioners – the individual members of IIOM

The education, training and experience that practitioners typically undertake enables them to work in accordance with Internationally recognised standards in such as IEC 62402:2019

With this in mind IIOM has developed a competence framework where essential competencies are defined at the Associate (AIIOM), Member (MIIOM) and Fellow (FIIOM) grades of membership



UK-SPEC is The UK Standard for Professional Engineering Competence, published by the Engineering Council, which sets out and maintains internationally recognised standards of education, training experience and ethical conduct. By this means everyone can have confidence in the skills and commitment of professional engineers including members of IIOM who have achieved AIIOM, MIIOM or FIIOM status.

Individuals will be able to demonstrate competence and experience to current and prospective employers, e.g. via post nominal letters

Enables international mobility, e.g. can be particularly useful in the context of international projects

IOM members will eventually have a route to Professional Registration with the UK Engineering Council (work in progress)

EngTech, IEng and CEng professional registration with the UK Engineering Council is widely recognised throughout the world

The Council is also the UK signatory of international agreements concerning engineering education and registration and is able to receive applications for European Engineer (EUR ING) registration

At the Associate (AllIOM) grade members are able to demonstrate that they meet the requirements of the competence framework by passing the IiOM Short Course in Obsolescence Management at IiOM Associate Grade available from as provided by the IiOM Endorsed Trainers. These are: -

Successful candidates are awarded a certificate confirming their Associate Member status and have the legal right to use the post-nominal letters AllIOM

- Options for Membership (MIIOM) and Fellowship (FIIOM) have been investigated, e.g. by benchmarking with other UK institutions including the IET, BCS, IMechE
- Criteria for MIIOM and FIIOM have been developed based on assessment of the applicant's learning, experience, responsibilities, and achievements (no exams)
- Draft application forms, supporter's forms, and guidelines have been produced and reviewed by the Professional Standards & Membership Committee and IIOm International Board.
- The programme is planned to be rolled out early in calendar year 2021. Applications will be accepted from April 2021.
